TRAINING MEMORATION # 5

- 1. Wehicles will be parked in line in a motor park in order to facilitate control of motor maintenance.
- 2. Howitzers Unless in use will be placed in a gum park and kept covered with paulins.
- 3. Drill schedules to include disciplinary drills, callstheatics at least 20 minutes per day; I hour marching; 2 hours maintenance, motors and material; orientation } hour. Athletics in the afternoon.
- 4. Organizations must take this opportunity to police up equipment, straighten out supplies, turn in extra equipment not needed except in battle. Camouflege nets will be cleaned, neatly folded, and retained in units. Basic load of ammunition will be kept on hand for the present.
- 5. Inspections of men in ranks will be held at intervals to improve the standard of clothing and the wearing of the uniform. Service ribbons will be worn at these formations. Wilitary courtesy and wearing of the proper uniform will be stressed. Special emphasis on saluting from vehicles when officers approach from rear. Head gear will be worn at all times except when engaged in athletics or when indepressed saddy needed.



- 1. Reference 0.1, # 53. Hq 85th Inf Div. 6 May 1945.
- 2. Bn commanders will institute immediate r connaissance for suitable CP and quarters within area assigned (See Overlay).
- 3. 403rd and 329th FA Bns will occupy area of responsibility without delay. 910th and 328th FA Bns will occupy area of responsibility when detached from CF control.
- 4. 403rd and 329th FA Bus patrol areas of 910th and 328th FA Bus respectively until such time as 910th and 328th FA Bus are able to occupy their areas of responsibility.
 - 5. Control of FELTRE falls to 329th FA Bn.
 - 6. Complete communications will be laid within Div Arty.
- 7. Btry installations will be located near Bn for best control. Roving patro/s will take care of guarding area of responsibility.
 - 8. Complete instructions for military control will be issued at a later date.

OPERATIONS MEMORANDUM NO. 27:

- 1. Reference: 0.I. #54, Hq 85th Inf Div, 9 May 1945.
- 2. Information has been received that small groups of enemy are still at large, hidden in out of the way areas in the Division Zone. Units will thoroughly patrol their assigned areas to make certain that all enemy have been cleared.
- 3. Units are reminded that prior to the entry of allied forces into the division area there existed in that area a force of partisans well organized into companies, brigades, and divisions whose intimate native knowledge of the terrain had been greatly enlarged by 18 months of combat with the enemy. This partisan force is still intact and eager to cooperate with allied forces in clearing away the Germans. Its members are considered reliable and are all equipped with an identity dard (Annex A) which distinguishes them from civilians who claim to be partisans.
- 4. Units are authorized to make use of such partisans within each unit sector as is considered advisable to gather up small enemy groups still at large.
 - 5. German representatives to accompany American patrols sent to search for enemy groups may be had upon application to this headquarters.
 - 6. A list of partisan forces, with locations of headquarters and sub-head-quarters and zones of responsiblity will be furnished unit commanders as soon as it is available.
 - 7. Captain Ross, R.A., AFHQ representative with partisan forces is available at Division Headquartes and may be contacted for information.

HEADQUARTERS 328TH FIELD ARTILIERY BATTALION

SUBJECT: Move to New Area.

TO : All Batteries.

1. This battalion will move to new area tomorrow, 29 May 1945.

a: Order of March: Charlie, Able, Baker, Headquarters and Service

b. Convoy Number: 88-5N-55

c. I.P. Time: 0800

d. Location of IP: Bn. CP in Lential.

2. Charlie Battery will leave their area so as to hit IP at 0800. "A", "B", Hq. and Sv. will move out at 15 minute intervals.

3. Upon arrival at new area Charlie and Able batteries will immediately unload and release the trucks attached to provisional trucking company.

4. Trucks from the Provisional Trucking Company will be in this Battalion Area sometime this afternoon or early evening and will be distributed in the following manners.

"C" -- 6 trucks
"A" -- 6 trucks
"B" -- 6 trucks
Hq. -- 3 trucks

Sv. -- 5 trucks

5. Loading of vehicles will be as neat as possible. Every man on a vehicle will have a suitable place to ride. Men will salute all officers. Convoy flage will be used on the lead and last vehicle in each march group.

6. Each battery will consider itself a separate march group with the Battery Commander as March Group Commander.
